About ICMC

The **INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED MEDIATORS AND CONCILIATORS (ICMC)** is the Professional body of Practitioners in Nigeria that regulates and sets standards for the practice of Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) especially mediation and the different models therein. The Institute trains prospective candidates and certifies them to practice Mediation professionally in Nigeria. ICMC exhorts and inspires organizations and multinationals to adopt professional Mediation as primary mechanism for addressing disputes and conflicts.

Mediation skills are life-skills for building and sustaining relationships and for assisting disputing parties in an assured, confident and professional manner. Individuals with the skills can also deploy same in helping to build organizations, strengthening their relationships, creating better homes, and by extension, better societies.

The Institute helps to structure the mandate of the Judiciary by helping and consulting to set up Multi-Door Courts (which in other words are court connected ADR centers) in all states of the federation including the F.C.T., training Judicial Officers in the practice of effective Justice Delivery System through ADR. The Institute helps multinationals in conflict designs, conflict transformation procedures and processes that helps in the ease of doing business, and building mutual beneficial consensus between conflicting and disputing parties and organizations.

The Institute was established in 1999, and is commemorating it's Silver Jubilee this year. **ICMC IS 25!**

Within the rank and file of the Institute are about twenty thousand (20,000) members spread across divers professions in different parts of the world. In Nigeria alone, the Institute has eighteen (18) branches spread across different States.

From the Office of the President

PROTOCOLS



On behalf of the Governing Council, I welcome you all to the 2024 ADR Conference and Induction Ceremony. It is my pleasure to also announce that 2024 equally marks the 25th anniversary of our dear Institute. We would during the Induction Ceremony/Dinner honour founding members, past Presidents and Registrars who have served the Institute since inception for their vision and determination to press through with a noble concept despite the many challenges that they were confronted with in an attempt to realize their dream of building an institution that will champion the cause of mediation in Nigeria and beyond.

We convene today at a critical juncture in the evolution of our profession and the global landscape to examine the conference

theme Rethinking Mediation Strategy in a Turbulent World: A Global Perspective". The complexities of a rapidly changing world, characterized by economic uncertainties, social unrest, and political polarization all demand a comprehensive re-evaluation of our mediation strategies.

THE GLOBAL CONTEXT

According to the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA), the number of armed conflicts worldwide has increased steadily over the past decade. This trend has been made worse by factors such as climate change, resource scarcity, and technological advancements. The Global Peace Index reports that the world's overall peacefulness has declined over the past 17 years.

These statistics underscore the urgent need for effective conflict resolution mechanisms. Mediation, as a voluntary and collaborative process, offers a promising avenue for preventing violence, fostering dialogue, and building lasting peace.

To illustrate the effectiveness of mediation in addressing complex global challenges, consider the following examples:

- The Northern Ireland Peace Process: Mediation played a crucial role in ending the decades-long conflict in Northern Ireland. Through a series of negotiations facilitated by international mediators, the parties were able to reach a power-sharing agreement that has endured for over two decades.
- The Colombian Peace Process: Mediation was instrumental in bringing an end to the 50-year armed conflict between the Colombian government and the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC). The peace agreement, facilitated by the Cuban government and the United Nations, has led to a significant reduction in violence and opened up new opportunities for peace building in the region.

Mediation In Action: Current Global Conflicts

Mediation continues to play a key role as can be seen in some current and ongoing global conflicts as follows;

- **The War in Ukraine**: Mediation efforts have been ongoing to find a peaceful resolution to the ongoing war in Ukraine. International mediators, including the United Nations and the European Union, have been working to facilitate dialogue between Russia and Ukraine, with a focus on ceasefires, humanitarian aid, and potential peace agreements.
- The Ethiopian Civil War: Mediation has played a crucial role in ending the Ethiopian Civil War, which lasted from 2020 to 2022 and reignited again mid-2023. The African Union-led mediation process facilitated a peace agreement that brought an end to the initial conflict and has paved the way for reconciliation.
- The Sudanese Civil War: Mediation efforts are ongoing to address the current conflict in Sudan, which was intensified by the coup in 2021. The African Union and the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) have been working to facilitate dialogue between the warring parties and promote a peaceful resolution.
- The Wider Middle East Conflict: Mediation has been a constant feature of the Middle East peace process, with efforts to find a lasting solution to the initial Israeli-Palestinian conflict, which has now snowballed into a wider middle eastern conflict involving Israel, Hamas in the Gaza Strip in Palestine, Hezbollah in Lebanon, the Houthis' in Yemen, Iran and the Shiíte militias in Syria and Iraq. International mediators, including Qatar, the United States, the European Union, and the United Nations, have facilitated numerous rounds of talks between the parties in order to de-escalate the situation and prevent it from deteriorating into an all-out regional war.
- The Conflict in Northeast Nigeria: Mediation has to some extent, been used to address the conflict between the Nigerian government and Boko Haram, a militant group operating in the northeast region of the country. Efforts to promote dialogue and address the root causes of the conflict have led to some reduction in violence and improved security in some quarters.

Adapting Mediation Strategies For a Changing World

In order to meet the demands of a turbulent world, we must adapt our mediation strategies in several ways:

- **Cultural Sensitivity**: Mediation must be tailored to the cultural context of the parties involved. This requires a deep understanding of different values, norms, and communication styles of the parties involved.
- *Inclusive Participation*: All stakeholders, including marginalized groups and communities, must have a voice in the mediation process. This can be achieved through community-based mediation, participatory approaches, and the use of interpreters.
- **Technological Innovation**: Technology can enhance mediation by providing new tools for communication, data analysis, and dispute resolution. For example, online platforms can facilitate virtual mediation, making it more accessible and efficient.
- **Preventive Mediation**: Mediation can be used proactively to prevent conflicts from arising in the first place. This involves early intervention, conflict analysis, and the development of preventive measures.

He previously served as Senior Peace and Development Adviser to the UN Resident and Humanitarian Coordinator in Kenya and Chief of the Peacebuilding Programme of UNDP Kenya (2008-2011); Senior Governance Adviser to the UN Resident Coordinator, and Head of the Governance Programme of UNDP Ghana (2004-2008); Head of Operations and Officer in Charge of the Sierra Leone Truth and Reconciliation Commission (2002-2004).

Dr Ojielo was formerly a human rights lawyer in Nigeria (1990-2002), a university academic (University of Nigeria, Enugu Campus and the Enugu State University of Science and Technology, Enugu, Nigeria, 1992-2001); President of the research and advocacy organization, Centre for Peace in Africa, Lagos, Nigeria (1993-2002); and former newspaper political affairs editor (1987-1989).

He is the founding President and Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Mediators and Conciliators, the largest mediation and conciliation organization in Africa with more than 20,000 members; Fellow of the Society for Peace Studies and Practice (SPSP), Nigeria; Fellow of the 21st Century Trust, London; and Fellow of the Austrian Study Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution/European Peace University, Stadschlaining, Austria. He is also a Member of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators of Nigeria.

He has first and advanced degrees in History; Law; Strategic and Project Management; as well as a PhD in Peace and Conflict Studies from the University of Ibadan, Nigeria. He has published two books, edited four others and scores of peer refereed articles and journal contributions

HIS EXCELLENCY, YEMI OSINBAJO, SAN, GCON

Immediate Past Vice President, Federal Republic of Nigeria



Professor Yemi Osinbajo served as the Vice President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria for two consecutive terms, from May 2015 to May 2023. He held the position of Attorney General and Commissioner for Justice in Lagos State, Nigeria, from 1999 to 2007, leading

significant judicial reforms that would become models for other states in the Federation. Before his political career, Professor Osinbajo was a Professor of Public law at the University of Lagos, a founding partner of SimmonsCooper, a prominent commercial law firm in Nigeria, and earned the prestigious rank of Senior Advocate of Nigeria. He served in

the Justice Sector of the UN mission in Somalia, and was a member of the UN SecretaryGeneral's committee on Rules on the Conduct and discipline of Peace Keeping forces. He was Ethics advisor to the board of the AFDB, and served as an independent director of CITIBANK Nigeria.

In public service, Professor Osinbajo played key roles in the formulation and implementation of various government initiatives and policies, notably in the areas of economic reform, social investments, human Capital development, digital and creative economy, climate action and energy security in African nations.

He chaired the National Economic Council comprising governors of all the States of Nigeria, the Inter-Ministerial Energy Transition Implementation Working Group, which was responsible for the development and execution of the Nigeria Energy Transition Plan in 2022. Three National development plans were formulated and implemented under his leadership and he led the successful implementation of Nigeria's Economic Sustainability Plan, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Beyond his tenure in office, Professor Osinbajo remains dedicated to advocating for climate action globally. In 2023, he was appointed as the first Global Advisor to the Global Energy Alliance for People and Planet (GEAPP) and Board Chair of the Climate Action Platform for Africa (CAP-A). He founded the North East Children's Trust, for the creation of

sustainable learning ecosystems for vulnerable children made orphans by the insurgency in North-East Nigeria, co-founded Future Perspectives, an organisation focused on innovation, founded Climate Positive, an independent climate action not-for-profit, and currently serves on the Board of the Mo Ibrahim Foundation. He also serves as Guardian of the UNDP led Africa Innovation Foundation (timbuktoo)

SENATOR SHEHU SANI

President, Civil Right Congress of Nigeria (CRCN)



Shehu Sani was born in Tudun Wada, Kaduna. He served in the Nigeria senate as a senator, He is an author, playwright and a human rights activist. He is the President of the Civil Rights Congress of Nigeria - (CRCN) and the Chairman of Hand-in-Hand, Africa.

He was a leading figure in the struggle for the restoration of democracy in Nigeria.

He contested and won the Kaduna Central Senatorial District on March 28, 2015.

Senator Shehu Sani has different experiences in national struggle for

He has served as a member of the African Union African Peer Review Mechanism, Member of the United Nation Reform Committee, appointed by Nigerian President as a Member of the Presidential Committee on Prison Reforms, Presidential Committee on the Control of Violent Crimes and Illegal Weapons, Presidential Committee on Petroleum Products Prices, Presidential Committee on Conflict Resolution, Member of the Niger State Judicial Commission of Inquiry, Member of the National Political Reform Conference, Member of the Charles Taylor Investigation Committee, also appointed by the Nigerian Government as a Board Member of the Nigerian Extractive Industry Transparency Initiative (NEITI).

Sani was a Member of the Presidential Committee on National Security and Civic Responsibility.

Catholic Bishop of Sokoto



Bishop Matthew Hassan Kukah, born on August 31, 1952, in Anchuna, Zangon Kataf Local Government, Kaduna State, is a revered Catholic priest, intellectual, and advocate for peace and justice in Nigeria. Ordained in 1976, he quickly distinguished himself through his commitment to interfaith dialogue, good governance, and human rights.

He holds multiple academic qualifications, including a PhD from the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London, and a Master's in Public Policy from Harvard's Kennedy School. His career spans pastoral leadership as the Bishop of Sokoto Diocese since 2011, and key national roles, such as his

participation in the Oputa Panel and leadership of the National Peace Committee. His efforts toward peaceful elections and national cohesion have earned him the title "Conscience of the Nation."

Bishop Kukah is also a scholar, having served as Pro-Chancellor of Nasarawa State University and published various works on national unity. His contributions led to the founding of The Kukah Centre, a think tank fostering public policy discussions, and the establishment of The Kukah Award to inspire young innovators in Africa. With an unwavering belief in the power of youth and intellectual growth, Bishop Kukah continues to be a beacon of hope and leadership in Nigeria's complex socio-political landscape.

PROF. UDENTA O. UDENTA

Director General, African Writers Institute



Professor Udenta O Udenta is a specialist in African and comparative literature, cultural studies and aesthetic theory, and currently Professor of Cultural Studies and Creative Writing, and the Director General of African Writers Institute, Abuja. Professor Udenta O Udenta, who became a Senior Research Fellow in African Studies and Senior Lecturer in the School of Humanities at Abia State university, Uturu in 1996, also attended capacity building/peace practice induction courses at the University of Bradford, UK; University of Melbourne, Australia; Massey University, Auckland, New Zealand; Singapore Mediation Centre; United States Institute for Peace (USIP),

Washington DC; Inter-Governmental Agency on Development (IGAD), Addis Ababa Ethiopia; and the Institute of Security Studies, South Africa, between 2001 and 2008, with specializations in conflict indicators and early warning signals; alternative dispute resolution strategies, with emphasis on restorative justice; and postconflict reconstruction and development modalities.

Professor Udenta O Udenta has written and edited over 21 books, apart from over 100 papers presented at national and international experts meetings, seminars and conferences, and at training and capacity building workshops. Some of his published works, apart from the sixvolume collection of his boyhood fictional, dramatic, poetic, philosophical and cultural creations, include, Crisis of Theory in Contemporary Nigerian Literature and the Possibilities of New Materialist Direction: Critical Fragments; Revolutionary Aesthetics and the African Literary Process; Art, Ideology and Social Commitment in African Poetry; Heroism and Critical Consciousness in African Literature; Art, Society and Identity: Essays on African Literature; Autonomy of Values: Determinations, Affirmations, Mediations; Illumination: Essays on Democracy, Peace, Culture and Social Development in Nigeria; and Democratic Transformation and Social Change in Nigeria (a personal journey from intellectual conscience to praxis).

Professor Udenta O Udenta holds the position of the Director of Strategy and Communications at the Centre for Alternative Policy Perspectives and Strategy (CAPPS), an Abuja based independent Think Tank and a Distinguished Fellow at Abuja School of Social and Political Thought. Between 1998 and 2009 he consulted for the following international organizations: The World Bank, DFID, UNDP, EU Nigeria Mission, USAID, International Republican Institute (IRI), National Democratic Institute (NDI), International Foundation for Election Systems (IFES), Global Rights, Institute for Democracy in South Africa (IDASA), British Foreign Office Parliamentary Group, Fredrich Ebert Stiftung and Konrad Adenauer Stiftung, on Culture and Development Matters; New Directions in Conflict Mitigation Strategies in Nigeria; Strengthening Democratic Institutions; Communication and Security Networking for Nigeria's General Elections; Building the Capacity of Civil Society Organizations; Building and Strengthening the Organizational Capacity of Political Parties; and the Strategic Conflict Assessment of Nigeria.

Prof Udenta O Udenta is also one of Nigeria's leading pro-democracy and civil rights activists. He was in the forefront of the popular democratic resistance against the despotic junta hegemony of General Sani Abacha under the Eastern Mandate Union (EMU) and NADECO banners. He was arrested and detained on several occasions, the longest spell being in June 1998. Upon the death of General Abacha he was released by the then Head of State, General

Abdulsalami Abubakar and, with the commencement of the Fourth Republic redemocratization process, was elected the National Secretary of Alliance for Democracy (AD), one of the three legally registered parties for the 1998-1999 political transition. An alumnus of the US State Department's International Leadership Visitors' Programme, Prof Udenta has addressed global political, strategic and leadership audiences in Germany, The Netherlands, Singapore, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, Austria, Ethiopia, South Africa and several other countries. One standout event worthy of mention was when he addressed the National Leadership Councils of the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), National Republican Institute (IRI), International Foundation for Election Systems (IFES) and the National Democratic Institute (NDI), in Washington DC in August, 1999.

Prof Udenta O Udenta, a native of Mgbowo, Awgu LGA of Enugu state Nigeria, is happily married to Princess Vivian Udenta, and has two sons, Chidera and Chinweikem.

She was Secretary to the Corporation and Legal Adviser to the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation from 2009 to 2011.

Prof Omorogbe has an extensive and deep knowledge of the Nigerian petroleum industry and the larger international energy industry within which she has operated over the last four decades. She has, been in the vanguard of petroleum industry reform, as a member of the two Oil and Gas Sector Reform Implementation Committees established respectively by President Obasanjo in 2000, and President Yar'Adua in 2007 for the reform of the industry. In the latter, she was the Chairperson of the Legal and Regulatory Subcommittee, which drafted the first Petroleum Industry Bill which was submitted to the National Assembly in 2008.

Prof Omorogbe's clients include international companies and government agencies within and outside Nigeria. Chief Judge, FCT High Court (RTD)



Hon. Dr. Justice Ishaq Usman Bello, OFR is a distinguished legal practitioner with a career spanning over four decades in Nigeria's judiciary. Born on January 5, 1956, in Abuja, Nigeria, he was called to the Nigerian Bar in 1983. Over the years, he has held various significant positions, including Magistrate of all grades, Legal Adviser, Deputy Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court of Nigeria, Judge of the High Court of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Abuja, Chief Judge of the FCT, and lots more. As Chief Judge, he played a key role in ensuring the efficient and seamless administration of justice. His tenure was marked by a commitment to judicial excellence and reform, contributing

greatly to the development of the legal system in Nigeria.

Bello's academic background is equally impressive. He holds a PhD in Law and a Master's degree in International Criminal Law from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, where his dissertation focused on individual criminal responsibility under the Rome Statute. In addition to his formal education, he has been awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws (LLD) by the Caribbean University. His other qualifications include certifications in international criminal law, civil procedure, advanced legal studies amongst others.
